#### The Wine Enthusiast **Buving Guide**

The Buying Guide includes ratings and reviews of new-release and selected older beverage alcohol products evaluated by Wine Enthusiast magazine's editors and other qualified tasters. If a wine was evaluated by a single reviewer, that taster's initials appear following the note. When no initials appear following a wine review, the wine was evaluated by two or more reviewers and the score and tasting note reflect the input of all tasters. Unless otherwise stated, all spirit reviews are by Kara Newman and all beer reviews are by John Holl.

Each review contains a score, the full name of the product, its suggested national retail price, its alcohol (abv) as reported to us by the submitter and a tasting note. If price or alcohol content cannot be confirmed, NA (not available) will be printed. Prices are for 750-ml bottles unless otherwise indicated

#### TASTING METHODOLOGY AND GOALS

All tastings reported in the Buying Guide are performed blind. Typically, products are tasted in peer-group flights of from 5-8 samples. Reviewers may know general information about a flight to provide context-vintage, variety or appellation-but never the producer or retail price of any given selection. When possible, products considered flawed or uncustomary are retasted.

Ratings reflect what our editors felt about a particular product. Beyond the rating, we encourage you to read the accompanying tasting note to learn about a product's special characteristics

Crown Point 2017 Cabernet Sauvignon (Happy Canyon of Santa Barbara). Dark and concentrated in the glass, this bottling immediately reveals an elegantly refined polish. Aromas of blackberry, dark cocoa and black pepper lead into a palate that's concentrated but perfectly ripe. Flavors of black currant, vanilla, toast and a hint of mint are wrapped in complex yet smooth tannins and ample, fresh acidity. -M.K.

#### Crown Point 2017 Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon (Happy Canyon of Santa Barbara).

Crafted from a single clone in a single block in a single barrel, this is the most focused expression of this ambitious, no-expense-spared project by Roger Bower. Deep, concentrated and yet elegantly focused aromas of blackberry, violet, charred wood and purple flowers lead into a palate that is framed by lush, silky yet upright tannins. Dark berry and mocha flavors lead into a vanilla and sea-salt caramel finish. Drink from 2037. Cellar Selection. -M.K.

Holus Bolus 2018 Franc de Pied Syrah (Sta. Rita Hills). Bold amounts of green peppercorn, sansho pepper, mixed olives and iodine meet with a tense black-raspberry aroma on this coolclimate Syrah. The palate is wild and amazingly herbal in flavor, with tea leaf, nettle and bay leaf elements and just enough lingering dark-berry fruit to fill it out. Editors' Choice. -M.K.

J. Coudray-Bizot 2013 Grand Cru en Orveaux (Echézeaux). Lifted red currant, gunpowder and flint shoot from the glass, announcing their insistence and pervasiveness. On the slender but concentrated palate, light gaminess plays around the edges, becoming more intense alongside the red currant core. This is an incisive and statuesque wine that holds a quiet sense of power. Bonhomie Wine Imports. Editors' Choice. -A.K.

Larkmead 2017 The Lark (Napa Valley). This is the producer's top-echelon wine, made from Cabernet Sauvignon and matured in 100% new French oak. Savory earth, clove and black tea accent a core of concentrated black cherry, cassis and plum, the two sides of the equation coming together to make for a cohesive, structured and complex whole. Best 2027-2032. Cellar Selection. -V.B.

Louis Latour 2018 Château Corton Grancey Grand Cru (Corton). A gentle floral hint, almost of jasmine, precedes the subtle red-cherry note of this wine. Coming in with slender grace, the palate is lightly edged by vanilla that softens the bracingly fresh red-currant note. The structure is graceful, yet enduring and firm. Freshness and fruit mingle in this fine edifice, shimmering with concentration and poise. Louis Latour Inc. Editors' Choice. -A.K.

Crown Point 2017 Estate Selection (Happy Canyon of Santa Barbara). There's a purity to the nose of this bottling that reveals deep, lush waves of boysenberry paste alongside a savory tone of charred beef. Polished tannins frame the sip, where ample amounts of rich black plum and blackberry are enhanced by caramel, coffee bean and mocha flavors, with acidity holding tight into the finish. —M.K.

Domaine Antonin Guyon 2018 Grand Cru (Corton-Bressandes). Ripe red cherry on the nose is perfumed with a leafy forest-fruit vibe. That lifted aroma carries over to the taut palate where it hovers above the firm structure, brightening the wine. Fine tannins crunch while freshness tingles, countered by 2018's ripeness. Taub Family Selections.—A.K.

**96** Larkmead 2017 Cabernet Sauvignon (Napa Valley). With 10% Merlot, this is a structured red that's built by broad tannins but approachable in its youth. Earthy peat, dried herb, cedar and cigar box play against a depth of dark cherry, cassis and plum, while fresh acidity permeates beneath, making for a cohesive package. —V.B. abv: 14.1%

96 Solomon Hills Estate 2018 Pinot Noir (Santa Maria Valley). A brisk raspberry aroma meets with bushels of bay leaf and green peppercorn on the excitingly herbaceous nose of this bottling from the appellation's most coastal vineyard. The same pepper and herb tones show on the savory sip, where juniper also arises alongside the cranberry and raspberry core. —M.K.




Vasse Felix 2016 Tom Cullity Cabernet Sauvignon-Malbec (Margaret River). This wine bears the unmistakable character of the region through notes of black currant, cedar, olive brine, bay leaf and cigar box. Layers of texture and flavor flow over the tongue, knit together by a powdery, fine line of tannins. Oak is present but should integrate seamlessly with time in bottle. It's a classy wine that walks a tightrope of power and elegance. Drink 2022–2040. Negociants USA–Winebow. Cellar Selection. —C.P.

Bien Nacido Estate 2018 Chardonnay (Santa Maria Valley). Energetic aromas of lemon peel, crushed chalk, shiso leaf, crushed oyster shells and light mint show on the sizzling nose of this bottling. The palate is fascinatingly mineral-driven, offering wet rocks and more seashells, but also waves of tangerine cream and grapefruit peel. Drink now through 2038. 
95 Bien Nacido Estate 2018 Pinot Noir (Santa Maria Valley). Lively aromas of hibiscus, raspberry, cherry, star anise and the slightest gamy funk show on the nose of this bottling. There is a more hearty tone to the complex palate, where riper strawberry and raspberry flavors meet with dewy lavender and resinous herbs. —M.K.

**95** Castelnau NV Hors Catégorie Brut (Champagne). A selection from the best lots in the producer's cellar, this limited-release Champagne is mainly aged in wood and spends extended time on the lees. It is a rich, full-bodied wine that shows balanced fruit and a hints of age. Drink now. Vinovia Wine Group. —R.V.

Domaine Delaporte 2018 Les Monts Damnés (Sancerre). This ripe, rounded wine is beginning to mature into rich, impressive fruit tones. Minerality, tight green fruits and an herbal edge are concentrated. It is sourced from the steep slope of one of Sancerre's most famous vineyards. Drink now. Vineyard Brands. Editors' Choice. —R.V. abv: 13.5% Price: \$53



CheckMate 2016 Attack Chardonnay (Okanagan Valley). This reserve-style wine is fermented in a single new foudre. Showing superb definition and focus, it bangs away with flint-edged tree fruit, spice, toast and a dash of sea salt. Drink through 2029. Cellar Selection. -P.G.

CheckMate 2016 Knight's Challenge Chardonnay (Okanagan Valley). Though not labeled as such, this is a vineyard selection from the Sunset Vineyard on the Black Sage Bench. Lively, spicy, fresh and textured, it bursts forth with apple and pear, then rolls across the palate with a streak of vanilla, some spring herbs and a pat of butter. Two-thirds was fermented with wild yeasts and half aged 16 months in new French oak. -P.G.

Eleven Eleven 2017 Laki's Vineyard Estate Cabernet Sauvignon (Oak Knoll District).


Meaty and thick in dense black fruit, sage and olive, this is an intensely complex and savory wine from a warm vintage. Oak plays its part, contributing to the weight and breadth, adding clove, black pepper and vanilla notes that work well against the rich fruit. Enjoy from 2027-2030. Cellar Selection. -V.B.

Folktale 2018 Whole Cluster Estate Vineyard Pinot Noir (Santa Lucia Highlands). One of Winemaker David Baird's whole-cluster experiments, this bottling shows plenty of lilac and violet aromas alongside baked strawberry and star anise. The floral expression happens on the sip, where toasted sage meets with red currant and a hint of licorice. -M.K.

Gary Farrell 2017 Rochioli-Allen Vineyards Gary Farren 2017 Rocalistic States (Russian River Valley). With flavors of apple skin, stone and Meyer lemon, this resplendent white is lifted and complex. Fresh, focused acidity girds an array of texture and nuanced flavor. It's light on its feet yet fully memorable in its remarkable balance and lasting grace. -V.B.

Gary Farrell 2017 Rochioli-Allen Vineyards 94 Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). Lifted and endurably fresh, this impressive wine opens in tones of wild strawberry, dried herb and forest floor, with a supple midpalate that teases a hint of power, settling into tension and texture. While light in style, it still has weight and breadth, finishing with balance and grace. -V.B.

Henri de Villamont 2010 Ordina 2012 Henri de Villamont 2012 Henri Henri de Villamont 2018 Grand Cru (Grandsroast pumpkin are restrained on the nose of this wine, hovering above a ripe cherry core. That same flavor combination appears on the palate, but here it is placed in a compact, firm structure pervaded by freshness and poise. Smoke and mocha hints carry a soft edge of vanilla, adding to the brooding elegance. Wegmans. -A.K.

Hertelendy 2016 Cabernet Sauvignon (Napa Valley). Blended with 11% Petit Verdot and small amounts of Malbec, Merlot and Cabernet Franc, this is a substantially powerful, integrated and complex red that's aged in both French and Hungarian oak. Immensely herbal, it offers seductive spice tones of clove and tobacco, with blue and red fruit lifted by underlying acidity. Enjoy from 2026-2031. Cellar Selection. -V.B.

Laurent-Perrier NV Cuvée Rosé Brut (Champagne). This great rosé combines texture with bright fruit and a bit of age. 


**94** Louis M. Martini 2016 Monte Rosso Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon (Sonoma Valley). Sumptuous, integrated and softly layered, this blockbuster wine from the historic site is intriguing in iron and crushed rock. The fruit is black and brambly—a mix of cherry, berry and currant dusted in cocoa powder. This will do well in the cellar. Enjoy from 2026–2031. *Cellar Selection*. —V.B. **abv:** 15.3% **Price:** \$150



**94** Lucienne 2018 Smith Vineyard Pinot Noir (Santa Lucia Highlands). Rich, opulent aromas of black-cherry cordial and caramel are thick but delicious on the nose of this bottling. Sandy tannins frame the creamy cherry and blackberry flavors, which are lifted by star anise and licorice accents and lead into an oaky finish. —M.K.



Margerum 2019 M5 Margerum Estate Vineyard White (Los Olivos District). Complex and yet utterly refreshing, this estate blend of 45% Grenache Blanc, 21% Marsanne, 14% Viognier, 13% Roussanne and 7% Picpoul Blanc begins with wet stone, chalk, nectarine, Rainier cherry and creamed pear on the crisp nose. The palate sizzles with acidity and ashy, chalky tension, delivering flavors of kiwi, lychee and more stone fruit. Editors' Choice. —M.K. abv: 12.8%



**94** Robert Biale 2018 Old Kraft Vineyard Zinfandel (St. Helena). Juicy and pleasing, with undeniable complexity, this great wine tastes of brambly blackberry, cinnamon and plum accented by leather, black pepper and nutmeg. While full in feel, it shows balance and elegance. The tannins are well structured and supportive of the fruit. —V.B. abv: 14.6%




94 San Simeon 2019 Estate Reserve Pinot Noir (Monterey). Fresh out of the gates, this bottling is singing in opulent aromas of Bing cherry pie, clove, mace and rosewater. There is a load of baking spice on the palate, from nutmeg to star anise, while the silky smooth mouthfeel presents flavors of cherry and mulberry. —M.K.




Schramsberg 2016 Crémant Méthode Champenoise Demi-Sec (Napa Valley). With a dry, floral nose, this lovely sparkler is a blend of 68% Flora, 31% Chardonnay and 1% Pinot Noir, with 15% barrel fermentation. Sweet, unctuous layers of peach, pear and vanilla biscuit are lifted by a balance of fresh acidity and underlying structure, making for a cohesive experience on the palate. —V.B. abv: 12.5% Price: \$40




**94** Solomon Hills Estate 2018 Chardonnay (Santa Maria Valley). Tightly woven on the nose, this bottling shows a bit of tangerine pith but the aromas are largely mineral driven, from wet river stones to crushed chalk. There is sharp acidity on the tip of the sip, where taut and focused flavors of lemon and Mandarin orange meet with that extreme stoniness. Drink through 2038. *Cellar Selection.* —M.K.

Torbreck 2017 RunRig (Barossa Valley). The cool vintage has done great things for Torbreck's most premium Shiraz. While it still sports broad shoulders, this bottling offers dashes of elegance and freshness. Black currant, plum, beet root, cocoa powder and gentle herbs and spices are supported by cola-like oak. The tannins are muscular but fine, tautly woven into the sleek mouthfeel. This should be a stunner with time. Drink 2022–2040. Delicato Family Wines. Cellar Selection. —C.P. abv: 15% Price: \$225




**94** Vincent Girardin 2018 Les Epenots Premier Cru (Pommard). A hint of freshness plays on the otherwise closed nose of this wine. Still tightly coiled, the palate presents a balanced picture of elegant firmness. Freshness and fine tannins create the structure upon which the vivid red cherry can shine. This wine is elegant, balanced and most promising. Drink 2025–2035. Vineyard Brands. —A.K.

**93** Castelnau 2006 Blanc de Blancs Millésimé Brut (Champagne). From a selection of Chardonnay vineyards, this Champagne has tight crispness along with a balanced minerality. The green apple and ripe pear flavors are shot through with citrus to yield a textured, fruity wine. Drink now. Vinovia Wine Group. —R.V.

Château de la Crée 2017 Clos Faubard Premier Cru (Santenay). Toasty oak casts spells of both vanilla and caramel onto almost candied notions of cherry on the nose. On the palate, the picture then turns to full-on sumptuousness of lovely, tart cherry fruit rounded and mellowed by baking spice. A tight web of fine tannins holds everything in place and supports that wonderfully pervasive freshness. Drink by 2030. Domaine Serene. —A.K. aby: 13.5%



**93** CheckMate 2016 Silent Bishop Merlot (Okanagan Valley). Aromas and flavors of black cherry, cherry tobacco and espresso propel this potent and dense Merlot. Despite the name, there's nothing silent about it, with herbal accents amplified by 100% native yeast fermentation and the polished tannins carved by 21 months in 100% new French oak. *Editors' Choice*.—P.G.

Q3 Cullen 2018 Wilyabrup Cabernet Sauvignon-Merlot (Margaret River). This Cab-dominant blend, from one of Margaret River's founding wineries, encompasses the essence of the region. Brambly fruit mingles with notes of tomato stem, tobacco leaf, black olive and menthol, supported by polished, cherry cola-like oak. The palate is medium bodied, while the crunchy, vibrant fruit is tempered by taut, sappy, textural tannins. Drink now-2040. Old Bridge Cellars. —C.P.

Domaine Carneros NV Cuvée de la Pompadour Méthode Traditionnelle Brut Rosé (Carneros). Blending 59% Pinot Noir and 41% Chardonnay, all estate-grown, this memorable sparkler shows a ripe strawberry flavor that is rich and exuberant. It finds balance in a contrast of Meyer lemon, tangerine and lingering minerality. —V.B.

**93** Domaine Jessiaume 2018 La Combotte (Pommard). Subtle notes of woodsmoke and freshly crushed blueberry immediately lend a sense of purity and freshness to this wine. The palate turns the blueberry into rounded black-cherry flavor, with ample juiciness and pervaded by supple yet firm tannins. It's a lovely and measured expression of the ripeness of 2018, showing generosity and full fruit along with freshness. MS Walker. —A.K. abv: 13% Price: \$48



**93** Eleven Eleven 2019 Beckstoffer Melrose Vineyard Sauvignon Blanc (Rutherford). Inviting aromas of wet stone, honeysuckle and grass are met by a wealth of grapefruit, lime and more stone on the palate, offering a lovely combination that impresses from start to lengthy finish. Elements of lemongrass add to an intriguing experience. —V.B.

Finca Allende 2016 Mingortiz Single Vineyard Estate Bottled (Rioja). This bold Rioja from a stellar vintage is quite potent and could use another five to 10 years in the cellar. Deep blackberry aromas are supported by lemony oak and char accents. A full-bodied palate has tannic bite and some heat to work through, while it tastes of blackberry, cassis and toasted oak. A high-octane finish confirms that this is a Tempranillo to drink through 2035. Trinchero Family Estates. Cellar Selection.—M.S.


Polktale 2018 Le Mistral Joseph's Blend (Monterey County). There's a wondrous array of herb and game aromas on the nose of this Grenache and Syrah blend, including charred beef, lavender and Dr Pepper alongside elderberry fruit. There is zippy acidity on the sip, where the licorice and lavender elements wrap around the brisk blackraspberry and plum core. —M.K.

Angela Vineyards 2017 Pinot Noir (Yamhill-Carlton). This is the first vintage from Winemaker Alban Debeaulieu, who succeeded Ken Wright in the spring of 2017. Vinified with natural yeasts, it's a detailed mix of tart red berry, yeasty grain and light streaks of cola and earth. Aged 10 months in one-quarter new French oak, it finishes with a kiss of chocolate. —P.G.



**Valley).** Lively, spicy and earthy, with an underlying foundation of dried herb, this wine offers buzzy energy and tension. Bright, racy acidity gives it life and length, finishing in black cherry, currant and black tea. —V.B.

Balletto 2018 Sexton Hill Vineyard Estate Grown Estate Bottled Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). **92** Campillo 2016 Crianza (Rioja). Tight-fisted plum and currant aromas are punchy, while this crianza from a great year excels across a lively palate. Spicy plum and currant flavors play out on a finish with cracked pepper notes and lingering acidity. Drink through 2025. Pacific Highway Wines & Spirits. —M.S.

**92** Cristom 2018 Louise Vineyard Pinot Noir (Eola-Amity Hills). This young, bright wine bursts open with raspberry and cherry fruit. The concentration and length are excellent, and it should benefit from additional bottle age. Drink from 2022–2030. Cellar Selection. —P.G.

D'Arenberg 2016 The Laughing Magpie Shiraz-Viognier (McLaren Vale). With 4% Viognier, the nose of this Shiraz-based wine offers an appealing mix of plum, fig cake, mocha, olive and large helpings of savory spice. The palate is powerfully tannic and chalky in texture. Nevertheless, the spicy, brambly fruit finds its way to the fore, providing much needed softness. Give this a decant or air time or plenty of protein if drinking now. Drink until 2028. Domaine Jessiaume 2018 Les Cents Vignes Premier Cru (Beaune). A subtle cloud of woodsmoke contains aromatic notions of ripe black cherry as well as a fresher, more tart note of cranberry in this wine.
